1.4 Whether there is any revision/update of regulation or syllabi, if yes, mention their salient aspects.
Our College is affiliated to University of Mumbai hence we follow the syllabus prescribed by University of Mumbai. University of Mumbai had revised the syllabus from the A.Y. 2012-13 with Credit and Grading system. It was made effective from A.Y 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2015-16 to First year, Second Year, Third year and Final year respectively. The credit system is as follows:
1 hour Lecture – 1 Credit, 1 hour Tutorial – 1 Credit, 1 hour practical – 0.5 Credit.
University of Mumbai again revised syllabus with Choice based Credit System from the A.Y 2016-17 onwards. It was made effective from A.Y 2016-17, 2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20 to First year Second Year, Third year and Final year respectively.
The Department level optional courses (DLOC) were introduced in Semester 5, Semester 6, Semester 7 and Semester 8, whereas institute level optional courses introduced in Semester 7 & 8 which are generic in nature.
In 2017-18, the Second year syllabus was modified. The total number of credits for a program is between 180-200. One lecture hour is one credit. One practical hour is 0.5 credit. Miniprojects are a part of many of the courses as per the new syllabus. This has given an incentive to project based learning.

### 2.8 Examination/ evaluation reforms initiated by the institution (for example: open book examination, bar coding, double valuation, photocopy, online multiple choice questions)

- a. Online MCQ tests and online evaluation is adopted by most teachers for internal assessment.
- b. There is a complete set of rubrics developed for project evaluation. The presentation is held 4 times in a semester.
- c. Rubrics are developed for laboratory evaluation and continuous assessment is carried out. The term work grades are obtained automatically based on the continuous evaluation.
- d. We also calculate the attainment level of course outcomes for all subjects.
- e. DQC of department checks the term test question papers to ensure compliance to the declared course outcomes and blooms taxonomy level.

Exam Cell has separate web site for online Examination form filling as https://www.somaiya.edu/kjsieit/administration/EXAM\_CELL.

#### Transparency and security of evaluation system is ensured:

- To eliminate the possibility of leakage of question papers, Digital Electronic Paper Delivery System (DEPDS) has been designed by University of Mumbai. In this, question paper is made available on the portal 90 minutes before commencement of paper. Question paper is obtained by authorized person through three tier securities as ID and password, OTP on authorized mobile and face recognition of authorized person. Principal, In-charge Exam Cell and two persons appointed by Principal are authorized persons to download question paper.
- After collection, answer books are masked and coded by hand to ensure security.
- Transparency and security is highly maintained during result preparation. Data entry is carried out under CCTV surveillance. Data entry operator enters marks directly from answer books in to result preparation software on password protected PC. In charge of Exam Cell verify final gazette (mark sheet) with individual subject mark sheets. After signing by Principal, the final gazette is send to the University for verification by University's moderation committee.

#### 2.12 How does IQAC contribute/monitor/evaluate the teaching & learning processes :

The contribution of IQAC towards teaching-learning process can be summarised as follows:

- One of the initial contributions of IQAC has been to create rubrics for assessment of
  project work, project presentation and project report and for laboratory work. This was felt
  necessary to bring regularity and uniformity in the assessment process and eliminate
  inconsistent allotment of marks. IQAC also created a logbook for documenting the wok
  done and included the rubrics as part of the log book to communicate the assessment
  criteria to students.
- This year we improved upon the idea and included the assessment matrix as cover page for laboratory experiments. This has made the assessment process extremely transparent and also makes it clear to the student why they have been graded in a particular way.
- On the insistence of IQAC, Bloom's taxonomy is incorporated in the teaching plan and question paper.
- IQAC has provided a format for calculating the course outcome attainment.
- IQAC has also a created a framework for the continuous evaluation of students according to the prescribed rubrics. This has created a transparency in the evaluation of term work.
- IQAC has advocated the creation of program articulation matrix for the departments to evaluate the attainment of program outcomes.
- To enable faculty to adapt to the changes, IQAC has organised as well as conducted training programs on all the above processes and on the importance of accreditation.
- The IQAC has been instrumental in improving the use of ICT by faculty. Majority of the faculty are using Google Classrooms for teaching.
- IQAC also conducts an internal audit of course files and has made concrete efforts towards implementing outcome-based education, thereby supplementing the activities of the academic committee.

#### 6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

#### **6.3.1** Curriculum Development

K. J. Somaiya Institute of Information Technology is affiliated to University of Mumbai in Maharashtra. It follows the curriculum set by University of Mumbai. The majority of the faculty is contributing to the development of the curriculum by the University in various capacities such as Member of Board of Studies and Syllabus Revision Committee Member. For the curriculum development, feedback is obtained from students, parents, industry experts, etc. and the same is forwarded to the Board of Studies (BoS) and Dean, Faculty of Technology

#### **6.3.2** Teaching and Learning

- The Institute conducts ICT based evaluation through assignment and quizzes for some courses using Google class rooms. This gives time for the student to think about the problem and at the same time, because of online format copying will be eliminated. The multiple choice questions are evaluated on line by using tools like Flubaroo/Google forms. The questions are usually conceptual and can be completed in a short time.
- Class rooms with ICT facility i.e. teaching aids available with the department are LCD Projector: 08 in each department, Laptops: 04 in each department, classrooms with internet connection:03/04 in each department, digital boards in institute: 05
- 75% attendance is compulsory. Students falling short of this have to attend classes and write make-up assignments based on university question papers.

This helps to bring them at par with the regular students.

- The weak students are identified and remedial lectures are conducted for them to improve their performance.
- Course exit Surveys, module exit surveys, are also conducted online for the teaching learning improvement.
- NPTEL lecture videos are also made available to all students and they are motivated to join the online NPTEL courses.

#### **6.3.3** Examination and Evaluation

#### Technology is effectively used in the examination management process:

Exam Cell has separate web site for online Examination form filling as <a href="https://www.somaiya.edu/kjsieit/administration/EXAM\_CELL">https://www.somaiya.edu/kjsieit/administration/EXAM\_CELL</a>.

#### Transparency and security of evaluation system is ensured:

- To eliminate the possibility of leakage of question papers, Digital Electronic Paper Delivery System (DEPDS) has been designed by University of Mumbai. In this, question paper is made available on the portal 90 minutes before commencement of paper. Question paper is obtained by authorized person through three tier securities as ID & Password, OTP on authorized mobile and face recognition of authorized person. Principal, In-charge Exam Cell and two persons appointed by Principal are authorized persons to download question paper.
- Transparency and security is highly maintained during result preparation. Data entry is carried out under CCTV surveillance. Data Entry Operator enters marks directly from answer books in to Result Preparation Software on password protected PC. In charge Exam Cell verify final gazette (mark sheet) with individual subject mark sheets. After signing by Principal, the final gazette is send to the University for Verification by University's moderation committee.

#### **6.3.4** Research and Development

Research and Development Cell has decided some strategies for improvement of R&D. They are as follows:

- There is an increase in seed money up to 2lakhs per department for need based projects.
- Expert talks of various research topics are arranged to motivate students and faculty.
- Students and faculty are encouraged to undertake projects of societal need for e.g. health care and agriculture.

- Steps are taken to fill the gap between the research stages and production stage i.e. a incubation centre exists at trust level.
- Students and faculty are motivated to participate in various projects competition, conferences and seminars to showcase their research work.

Research and development policy is continuously revised to promote the research in the institute.

#### **6.3.6** Human Resource Management

- Our HR department is involved in overall development of faculty and staff.
- As per Government Norms, Gratuity, Provident fund, Medical Insurance is given to all the faculty members and Group medical Insurance is given to non-teaching Staff.
- Local Travelling Allowance is allowed to staff and faculty
- To encourage higher studies and to enhance academics as well as carrier of teaching staff a facility of Paid leave (Prescribed in Higher Education Policy) will be given to desired candidate.
- To encourage higher studies and to enhance academics as well as careers of non-teaching staff members, facility of reimbursement of fees paid as per Institute Policy.
- To encourage extra co-curricular activity all non-teaching staff members are allowed to participate in intercollegiate tournaments of sports and in Cultural activities.
- No Professional tax to the handicap staff members.
- To encourage the faculty members to participate in Research and Development activity, sponsorship is provided for participation in workshops and conferences as per policy.
- Institute has a policy of reimbursing 50% of tuition fee of wards of non-teaching employees enrolled in Engineering.

#### **6.3.7** Faculty and Staff recruitment

- KJSIEIT believes in selecting inspiring teachers who motivate students by innovative thinking and practical examples in their approaches. KJSIEIT follows UoM and AICTE rules for selecting its faculty. While recruiting faculty, Institute ensures faculty strength and profile as per AICTE norms. Applications are invited after the approval of the advertisement by Management and UoM from eligible candidates through advertisement in the national daily newspapers.
- The Vice Chancellor of university appoints his VC Nominee who supervises whole selection process. Management of Somaiya Trust appoints subject experts and interviews are conducted by this committee for the shortlisted candidates. Suitable candidates are selected and appointed. Recommendation report for approval of the teachers is submitted to the UoM.

• However, in the case of vacancy that arises in between two interviews conducted by the university, ad hoc interviews are conducted. The LMC forwards proposal to fill the vacant posts to the GB. After approval from GB, the advertisement is given in local newspapers for walk-in interviews. The suitable candidate is selected by a local selection committee formed by the Principal keeping in views university norms.

#### **6.3.9** Admission of Students

The Institute is a part of the Centralised Admission Process (CAP) of Directorate of Technical Education (DTE) / Admission Regulating Authority (ARA), Government of Maharashtra. All the rules & regulations and admission process is made available on official website www.dte.org and also published in the form of information brochure.

Institute handles the admission to 71% of the total seats sanctioned. The remaining 29% seats are through CAP and handled by DTE. The Institute level 71% seats consists of 51% minority seats and 20% institute level quota. The admissions to both these quotas are strictly as per the norms prescribed by DTE/ARA. The process is purely based on merit. No capitation fee is availed even for the Institute level seats. The list of students who have applied are displayed on the notice boards and the admissions are offered through counselling in a well-defined and transparent manner

- While recruiting faculty, Institute ensures faculty strength and profile as per AICTE
  norms. Applications are invited after the approval of the advertisement by Management
  and UoM from eligible candidates through advertisement in the national daily
  newspapers.
- The Vice Chancellor of university appoints his VC Nominee who supervises whole selection process. Management of Somaiya Trust appoints subject experts and interviews are conducted by this committee for the shortlisted candidates. Suitable candidates are selected and appointed. Recommendation report for approval of the teachers is submitted to the UoM.
- However, in the case of vacancy that arises in between two interviews conducted by the university, ad hoc interviews are conducted. The LMC forwards proposal to fill the vacant posts to the GB. After approval from GB, the advertisement is given in local newspapers for walk-in interviews. The suitable candidate is selected by a local selection committee formed by the Principal keeping in views university norms.

Yes. Financial audit is managed by Somaiya trust office. Dates of external and internal audits are communicated through trust office to KJSIEIT. Outside agencies are appointed for both internal and external audits. Both audits are done twice in a year in a order internal audit followed by external audit. Internal audit is done by V.K.Kanere & Company. External audit is done by N.N.Desai & Company. Head office sends circular regarding audit time to time. In audits, voucher, cash, bank vouchers, bills, purchase order, cash transactions, pity cash vouchers, physical balance checked. Purchase register is also checked. Entries in Tally software as well as voucher entries are checked. Expenditure and capital entries are verified. After internal audit, external audit is scheduled which verifies suggestions given by internal auditor and action taken. If any issues/queries are there, its discussed with accountant. Final report is sent to the head office.

#### Following are the innovations introduced during this academic year -2017-18:

- 1. Improved Feedback on teaching learning In addition to course exit survey taken at the end of the semester, we have introduced module exit survey after completion of every unit to enable prompt remedial actions. Feedback on curriculum from industry experts, parents, alumni and students are also conducted.
- 2. Creation of Special Interest Groups- We have in total around 40 special interest groups as Cyber Security Cell, SDC, IOT, project competition cell and clubs as Green Club, Infinite loop etc. The students are encouraged to participate in various activities by these groups.
- 3. Practice of OBE tool- The institute is practicing Outcome Based Education. For each course, outcomes are defined which are measurable and specific. Course outcome levels are calculated by direct and indirect method to attain the target level with the help of OBE tool which gives summary report of attainment calculations. This year we have improved our methods and introduced a new automated tool to make analysis easier. Using this tool, the attainment levels of each assessment method can be obtained.
- **4.** International Conference on Advances in Sciences and Technology and Project Competition- WE have organised our first international conference ICAST-2018. The selected papers were published in UGC approved journals.
- **5. Appreciation to Faculty members:** Faculty members were appreciated for their performance in academics, research and extra-curricular activities.
- **6. Uploading of Video lectures on website:** The teaching methods used by the faculty members are uploaded on college website. In particular, pre-lab and video lectures of a few subjects are available on YouTube.
